Council Resolution No. 3 Series of 2022

A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE APPROVAL OF THE OFFICIAL LOGO OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL AGAINST CHILD LABOR BY THE PRESIDENT

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 92 was signed on 17 September 2019 institutionalizing the National Council Against Child Labor to upscale the implementation of the Philippine Program Against Child Labor and to amplify government efforts for the protection of the rights of vulnerable sectors, especially the children, strengthen related institutional mechanisms, and establish further measures that will contribute to the prevention, reduction, and elimination of any form of child labor;

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Executive Order No. 92 provides that the Council shall coordinate and conduct advocacy campaigns and information dissemination on child labor and existing laws related thereto;

WHEREAS, every year since 2002, the Philippines joins the annual observance of the World Day Against Child Labor (WDACL) to highlight the plight of child laborers and to demonstrate the country's solidarity in the campaign against child labor;

WHEREAS, during its meeting on 27 January 2022, the Council discussed and approved the conduct of the National Council Against Child Labor Logo-Making Contest as well as its mechanics in celebration of the 2022 WDACL;

WHEREAS, from 7 February to 20 April 2022, the Council Secretariat has received 189 entries for the NCACL Logo-Making Contest;

WHEREAS, the Council Secretariat, acting as Shortlisting Panel, shortlisted all submitted entries, identified the ten semi-finalists, and endorsed the entries of these semi-finalists, through a Resolution approved on 5 May 2022, to the five (5) Chairpersons of the NCACL Technical Working Groups (TWGs) for the next level of judging;

WHEREAS, the five (5) Chairpersons of the NCACL TWGs – Council for the Welfare of Children, DOLE Bureau of Working Conditions, DSWD Program Management Bureau, Philippine Information Agency, and DOLE Planning Service – acting as Semi-Final Judges, have identified the five (5) finalists and endorsed the entries of these finalists, through a Resolution approved on 25 May 2022, to the members of the NCACL for the final level of judging;

WHEREAS, during the meeting for the deliberation on the judging of finalists, the Final Judges have identified the ranking of the five (5) finalists through a Resolution approved on 23 June 2022;

WHEREAS, during the 2022 World Day Against Child Labor Culminating Activity held on 27 June 2022, the winners of the NCACL Logo-Making Contest were announced wherein the entry of Adrian G. Ongtingco ranked first;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Republic Act No. 8491 (Flag and Heraldic Code of the Philippines), the logo must first be submitted to the National Historical Commission of the Philippines for approval by the Office of the President prior to official use;

WHEREAS, acting on the Memorandum from the DOLE as Chairperson dated 31 August 2022 requesting the Council members to choose their preferred NCACL logo, majority chose the revised winning logo containing the texts "*National Council Against Child Labor*", "*Philippines*", and "*2019*" to be the official logo of the Council;

WHEREAS, during the 4th Regular Meeting of the NCACL on 3 November 2022, the members agreed to recommend to the President the approval of official logo of the Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Council recommends to the President the approval of the below official logo of the National Council Against Child Labor to be used in its official communications as well as in printed and digital materials.



Symbolism and Significance


- Child reading a book** : Every child's right to education
- Kite** : Every child's right to rest, relax, play, and take part in cultural and creative activities
- Hand** : Commitment of the National Council Against Child Labor to provide special protection to children that will contribute to the prevention, reduction, and elimination of any form of child labor in line with the vision of a child labor-free Philippines
- Sack and hammer at the back of the child** : Signifies freedom of the child from child labor as a result of the initiatives of the Council and its partners against child labor
- 2019** : Year of institutionalization of the Council pursuant to

Executive Order No. 92, Series of 2019

Colors blue, green, yellow, red, and orange : Adopted from the colors of the pinwheel/official logo of the World Day Against Child Labor – the celebration that draws attention to the global extent of child labor and the efforts needed to eliminate it. The Philippines annually joins this international observance to raise awareness on the plight of child laborers and to demonstrate the country's solidarity in the worldwide campaign against child labor.


